ESCAPE OF BEN WEBBER IS BEING INVESTIGATED

Person Responsible for Disappearance of City Prisoner May Be Prosecuted

Police officers responsible for the safe keeping of Benjamin Webber, a city jail prisoner who has been missing since April 5 or 6, probably will have to answer to the state of California for his disappearance, as it is not a case within the jurisdiction of the police commission.

Section 108 of the penal code of the state provides that an officer who voluntarily permits a prisoner to escape may be punished by a fine not exceeding \$10,000 or imprisonment not exceeding ten years in the state prison.

Section 109 of the same code provides that where a prisoner committed to jail upon a conviction for a public offense is permitted to go at large out of jail except by legal order or process it is an escape.

Webber, who probably has been arrested more than any other prisoner confined within the four walls of the city jail, is a paid-for trade. He was charged with five months ago on a charge of drunkenness and given a sentence of six months.

While at work about the building he excited the sympathy of a number of citizens, and upon their petition to Police Judge Williams and his promise to abstain from the use of liquor the remainder of his sentence was suspended.

April 2 he was released from custody with fifty-six days of his sentence to serve. The following morning at 3 o'clock he was again arrested and returned to jail to serve the remainder of his suspended sentence.

A few days after his arrest this time he was permitted to go about the building doing painting and varnishing. Some time between April 4 and April 5 he was given his clothes and permitted to escape.
