

AMERICAN SAVINGS BANK IS IN NEW HOME Institution Fits Up Quarters in Palatial Style at Second and Spring

Hundreds of depositors and friends of the American Savings bank called at the handsome new home of the flourishing institution in the American bank building yesterday, where all were most cordially received by President Hervey, Vice President Boyle Workman and other officials.

The American Savings bank is now permanently located in the refitted quarters in the old Los Angeles Trust building, on the northeast corner of Spring and Second streets, the property purchased some time ago by a local investor and rechristened the American Bank building.

EQUIPMENT IS MODERN In one corner of the lobby are placed the public telephone instruments and inviting rest places for women and other patrons. Over the windows are desks and other conveniences for the public.

A STRONG INSTITUTION The American Savings bank was organized and commenced business January 1, 1905, and now has total resources aggregating \$2,500,000, the resources of the bank having been increased \$1,000,000 since January 1, 1909.
