

RECKARD DECIDES ON RENO

Arrangements for Big Fight Are Already Being Pushed at Nevada Town

SITE FOR ARENA IS CHOSEN

Positive Assurance Given That Authorities Will Not Interfere with Battle

OGDEN, Utah, June 21.—Gov. Dickerson of Nevada, who is in Ogden today, declared that he will not interfere with the Jeffries-Johnson fight. When seen by a representative of the Associated Press this morning, soon after his arrival from Ontario, Oregon, the governor of Nevada said that the laws of the state license prize fighting and that, therefore, the executive of the state is without authority to stop the big fight.

RENO, Nev., June 21.—With Reno definitely selected as the battleground, with positive assurance from the governor that no attempt will be made by the authorities and with preparations already under way for building the arena, the Jeffries-Johnson fight tonight seems to be a foregone conclusion.
