MAKES LAST PAYMENT ON BEAR CREEK PROPERTY. Transferring Valuable Alleghany Gold Mine.

NEVADA CITY, July 4.—A mining deal of much importance to the Alleghany district was consummated in this city Saturday, when J. W. Evans and partners made the last payment on the Bear creek mine.

When the new owners assumed control of the Bear creek properties they started to develop them in a systematic manner. Not much was done, but they went right ahead and opened up a fine show of free-milling ore.

OLD CHEROKEE BLOCK LEASED AT GOLDFIELD

GOLDFIELD, July 4.—A lease on the old Cherokee block on the Atlanta has been granted to the Queen Consolidated Mines company, headed by J. O. Buckley.

This new lease will in no wise affect the plan of operations of the Queen Consolidated's original ground, where the shaft has now attained a depth of about 653 feet, and is headed for 750.

A drift will be driven on this ore shaft to thoroughly develop it at this depth. The shaft will also be unwatered to the 650 level, where a cross-cut was driven to the vein, but not a shot was put into it before work was stopped on account of financial entanglements.

TREASURE VAULT AT RAY SACKS ARE FOR SHIPMENT

RAY, July 4.—Work is proceeding vigorously at the Teresa mines, property of the Treasure Vault Mining company. There are now twelve men at work taking out and sacking ore preparatory to shipping.

There is considerable ore a carload of ore on the dump. It is a matter of but a few weeks until ore will be shipped from the Teresa mines to the smelter. It has been found advisable to sack the ore to save the gold that would otherwise be lost.

SELLS INTEREST IN PLACER

Official records show that Harrison Yarnall has sold an interest in several placer mines near Stanton, in Yavapai county, Ariz., to P. A. Derge and others for the sum of \$900, and the ground is to be operated in the near future in the report made. C. J. Sanders and George Oakman also disposed of many quartz mines to the Copper Verde Mining company, located in the Black Hills, the consideration named being nominal.

TO WORK IN KITTLEMAN

It is rumored that a company is being formed to operate in the vicinity of the Kettleman hills, but it has been impossible to confirm the report whether the company will buy or lease the land. The principals in the new corporation are well known here, being J. R. Baird, W. H. Young and C. M. Cross, of the Cross Lumber company.

COMER SHIPS BULLION

The first bar of gold bullion from the Comer Bros. mine at Walker has been received by the Prescott National bank. It was valued at \$350, and will be followed in a few days by another, the property producing it being under operation steadily.

DOUGLAS GREAT SMELTING CENTER

Production for Month Shows a Large Output of the Red Metal Continue Yearly

Douglas continues to remain one of the greatest centers of the world's copper production. No falling off or diminution in the output of the great reduction works, the smelters of the Copper Queen Consolidated Mining company and the Calumet & Arizona Mining company appears.

MEXICO TO BUILD NEW NATIONAL UNIVERSITY

Will Be Located on Site of Oldest Institution of Learning in America

MEXICO CITY, July 4.—The department of public instruction proposes to erect the new National university on the site of the original institution, the oldest institution for higher learning in America. By order of Charles V of Spain it was established in 1551 and was opened two years later on what is now Calle de Moneda, just north of the national palace.

GEM'S TANGLED AFFAIRS WILL SOON BE ADJUSTED

Property to Pass Into Other Hands--Negotiations Are Now Being Arranged

COALINGA, July 4.—The tangled affairs of the Gem Oil company will soon be straightened out and drilling will shortly be resumed on the property if the present plans of B. B. Ellis and the creditors of the defunct company are carried out.

Ellis has been negotiating with outside parties and has arranged for turning the property over to a new company as soon as the creditors are satisfied. The new company offered to apply \$2000 a month on the accounts, paying the indebtedness in full, and Ellis has the signatures of practically all the creditors that this plan will suit them.

The Gem started amid a blaze of glory last year, when Ellis secured a lease from Montgomery Bros. and arranged to drill a number of wells, and also having an option to purchase. A rig was erected on the property and the hole drilled to about 500 feet, when financial difficulties caused the company to shut down.

A short time ago some of the material was sold at sheriff's sale to pay some of the smaller creditors, the balance of the material being under attachment. The National Supply company is the largest creditor, and the Coalinga Lumber company also has a large bill against the Gem. All the creditors are satisfied with the arrangement of monthly payments. The total indebtedness is about \$11,000.
