FOOTBALL RULES ARE NOT YET COMPLETE

Publication of New Code for 1910 Delayed by Slothfulness of Committee

There has been considerable figuring among the local football enthusiasts as to the outcome of the deliberations of the football rules committee, and the fans have been on the anxious seat to discover the first news relative to the publication of the new regulations. From the American Sports headquarters the following letter has been sent, giving the status of the case, and it looks like the governing committee will continue its deliberations for some time to come.

"We have been for the past month receiving letters from store managers and others asking us to forward to them the football rules for 1910. We have been asked how soon we are going to publish this book, and we have been asked other questions in relation to the football rules for 1910. I beg to advise you that we have not as yet received from the football rules committee the official rules to publish, and at this writing it is impossible to give you the exact date of publication. However, it is the intention of the publishers to publish this book this year as soon as possible, and when we receive the final O. K. on the rules from the rules committee, we will rush to press with the guide and issue immediately thereafter. What date that will be at the present time we cannot state, because we do not know when the rules committee will get through with the rules. It may be a week and it may be four weeks. Therefore, you can state if anyone is anxious to get a copy of the rules, that the publishers have not received the rules. But it is the intention of the publishers to publish as soon as the rules are received."


