

EXPECT HARMON TO REMOVE SHERIFF

Prophecies at the Scene of Ohio Lynching Look for Retirement of Official

GOVERNOR SILENT ON PLANS Special Grand Jury Requested to Investigate Death of Anti-Saloon Detective

NEWARK, Ohio, July 9.—With the town quieted from yesterday's frenzy that ended in the lynching of Carl Etherington, "dry" detective, the city authorities tonight are making preparations for the aftermath.

Mayor Herbert A. Atherton tonight announced that if the anti-saloon league sent another raiding party he would declare martial law and call upon Gov. Harmon for troops.

"If Harmon attempts to remove me I will fight him to the last ditch," declared the mayor. Judge Seward of the common pleas court stated tonight that he might call a special grand jury to investigate the lynching.

Among prophecies made here today was one that would seek to remove both Sheriff Linker and Mayor Atherton. There is considerable doubt as to what authority he has in the latter instance.

Dispatches from Newark say that Prosecutor Smyth called on Common Pleas Judge Seward today for the immediate empanelling of a special jury to investigate the lynching of Carl M. Etherington, the special officer of the anti-saloon league workers.

Judge Seward said he would give his answer Monday. Prosecutor Smyth today said at Newark that he would use every means at his disposal to bring those guilty of mob violence to justice.

Such a farm, properly managed, ought to be a source of revenue to the city.

NEWARK, Ohio, July 9.—After eighteen hours of turmoil following the raid on alleged "speakeasies" yesterday which resulted in the shooting to death of William Linker, detective, the lynching of Detective Carl Etherington, who confessed to firing the shot that ended Howard's life, Newark is quiet today.

All morning a crowd surrounded the morgue where the bodies of Howard and Etherington are held awaiting word from relatives. The telephone pole from which the detective was hanged is guarded from the ravages of relic hunters, but before the city officials encased it in sheet iron the pole had been hoisted half through by those who sought mementos of the night's work.

Adjutant General Weybrecht, Colonel Byron Barger of the Fourth regiment, Ohio national guard, and Lieutenant Benjamin Chamberlain of troop B, who came to Newark to make an investigation of the affair, returned to Columbus today. Newark's trouble is anticipated. The next grand jury will investigate the lynching.

Adjutant General Weybrecht says Linker county officials, particularly Sheriff William Linker, are responsible for the lynching of Etherington. He will so report to Governor Harmon.

"The lynching easily could have been prevented," said General Weybrecht. "The established fact that the mob worked at the jail for two hours tells the story of negligence. If troops had been sent for when they should have been the state of Ohio would not now be disgraced."

Preparations are being made for a great funeral demonstration for William Howard, former chief of police, who died of a wound administered by Etherington in the "dry" raid that ended so disastrously last night.

which he intended to serve on Mayor Atherton and Sheriff Linker of Newark this afternoon for not upholding the laws of Ohio, and for aiding the lynchers, and also on several proprietors of "speak easy" places for violating the local option law of the state in serving beer in "dry" territory.

Secretary Long today received a telegram from Governor Harmon, who is at his summer home at Charlevoix, Mich., stating that the latter would leave for Columbus at once and take charge of the situation at Newark. The governor is expected some time tomorrow.

NEW YORK, July 9.—Kermit Roosevelt, who was with his father on the African hunting trip, sailed today for Europe in company with Congressman William Cocks of Oyster Bay on the steamship America.

Having been away for fifteen months it was expected that Kermit would pass the summer at Oyster Bay and his trip to Europe is a surprise to his friends.

NEW YORK, July 9.—Dynamite bombs placed under the new trestle being built by the Lehigh Valley Railway company along the bay shore of Jersey City exploded early today, badly damaging the steel structure and smashing windows for half a mile around in the Greenville section.

As the result of the first explosion two 60-foot iron girders were wrenched from their position, one of them being driven through a steel car on the New Jersey Central siding near the trestle. For forty feet on either side of the point of detonation the cement foundations of the structure were shattered. A second explosion three quarters of an hour later tossed up two more girders and destroyed an even greater amount of concrete construction.

The company constructing the trestle has recently declared an open shop.

SAN FRANCISCO, July 9.—The body of the man found beside a roadway near this city last night was identified today as that of E. A. Kees, a bookbinder of Oakland. The identification was made by the dead man's mother and sister.
