TRANSUE'S VOTES Demurrage—This bill provided for the imposition of penalties upon railroads failing to provide freight cars within a reasonable time...

CRIMINAL LIBEL—MADE CRIMINAL LIBEL A FELONY

Change of venue—This bill was practically identical with that which was so vigorously opposed by the friends of the graft prosecution in San Francisco...

GRAND JURY PROVIDED THAT UPON APPLICATION OF THE DEFENDANT

Grand jury provided that upon application of the defendant the grand jury must hear evidence in his behalf. One of the most vicious measures of the session...

TRANSUE'S VOTES

Primary registration—Provided for an official primary, with registration of voters with their party affiliations as a qualification for voting at such primary.

TRANSUE'S RECORD IN THE LEGISLATURE

1909 has been exploited. On eight test measures he voted wrong seven times. The measure known as the "gag" rules; fought for emasculation of the federal steamship resolution...
