CHINESE SENATE TO MEET OCT. 3

Assembly Is First Step in Constitutional Government of Vast Empire

MILITARY SCHOOL A FAILURE Ministers' Attempt to Centralize Executive Power Meets with Opposition

SHANGHAI, Aug. 19.—China is slowly but steadily progressing toward the establishment, at least in outward form, of constitutional government.

October 3 has been fixed for the opening of the first session, but the members are to assemble before that date to make all preparations satisfactorily for the inauguration.

Grand councillors and ministers will be entitled to attend the debates, but will not be permitted to vote.

It is reported from Peking that as a preliminary to the adoption of constitutional institutions the government is taking steps to centralize the administrative power.

That the German government has already intimated to the British government that some agreement might become possible after all the provisions of the present German navy acts have been fulfilled.

It is plain that the influence of the big navy party outweighs that of the little navy group.
