SEALS TRIM ANGELS BY 3-0 SCORE AND WALK OFF WITH WEEK'S SERIES

Miller Has Better of Castleton in Pitching Duel, Berry's Twirler Being Accorded Indifferent Support at Critical Times—Vitt Defeats Howard in Running Race and Further Distinguishes Himself by Pulling Off Star Catch of Foul Against the Left Field Bleachers.

Old Man Mohler and his Seals wound up their eight games here yesterday by trimming the Angels in handy fashion, 3 to nix. The game was more of a pitching bout between Castleton and Miller than anything else, and the latter came in for all the honors.

The game was almost featureless, save for a little fast work by Vitt. The Seals' third baseman executed one of the most sensational catches of the season in the sixth inning when he gathered Howard's foul off the left field bleachers fence and helped retire the Angels just when they really threatened with a run.

Business was slack then until the third frame, when the Seals came in for their second run. Miller was retired on a pop to Wheeler, and Madden slammed Castleton's tender to the center field fence for a clean two-sacker.

Things looked bad for the Angels again in the fifth, but they managed to pull through without allowing a run. With Berry down Melchior singled to left, Miller placed an easy one in front of the plate, but Castleton made a bad toss to Wheeler and the runner was safe, Melchior traveling to the corner which he had just cleared.

The Angels came close to registering in the sixth inning, when Daley managed to get as far as third. Pete got his start in life when Madden dropped his long fly to the center pasture, and might have arrived at third had he not dogged it at the start.
