Writer to Herald Says That the Southwest Will Benefit by San Francisco Exposition

Editor Herald: As party speakers have advised voting against all the amendments, and on that basis it would cost San Bernardino county alone \$650,000, I desire to correct same by advising that we vote "yes" on at least assembly constitutional amendment No. 33, which would tax San Francisco to tax herself alone for \$5,000,000 for the exposition, as the consent of the voters of the state is necessary, and also that on the state tax it will cost San Bernardino county only \$100,000, or \$25,000 a year. So I ask that we all vote for senate constitutional amendment No. 52, taxing the whole state of California to raise \$5,000,000 for the exposition at San Francisco. I am no more fond of paying taxes than the next one, but I believe it will pay us financially and much better accordingly than it will pay the city of San Francisco, as, if all the present plans are carried out, the tax will be as follows:

San Francisco subscription.....\$ 7,500,000 San Francisco special bond tax by her alone..... 5,000,000 San Francisco state share of tax..... 1,000,000 Total amount..... 13,500,000 Los Angeles county's share of state tax a little over..... 1,100,000 San Bernardino county about..... 100,000 Riverside county..... 3,550,000

As the figures show I believe Los Angeles county will get three times the benefit, and San Bernardino and Riverside counties twice as much for the dollars they pay as San Francisco will.


