

CONSOLIDATED MIDWAY BRINGS IN NEW OIL WELL

Second Bore on Section 32 to Be Flowing Soon—Executive Committee Named

N. J. Monette, president of the Consolidated Midway Oil company, has received a telegram from the field announcing that well No. 1, on section 32, in the oil sand eleven feet and will probably be flowing by the end of the week. This will make the Consolidated Midway's second well on section 32.

MINE ON INDIAN FLAT MAKES IMPROVEMENTS

NEVADA CITY, Nov. 24.—Extensive work is going on at the Coan mine, near Indian Flat. C. D. McLaughlin recently secured a bond on the property from the Coan and since he took hold a great amount of improvement work has been accomplished. No less than 50,000 feet of timber has been hauled on the ground, while the new hoisting works are nearly completed.

STATE BUREAU ISSUES MAP OF WHITTIER-OLINDA FIELD

The California state mining bureau has issued a map of the Whittier-Olinda field. To make the map complete a large number of original maps and surveys were used. These were furnished by the Santa Fe railway system, the Puente Oil company, the Standard Oil company, the Los Angeles Gas and Electric corporation, the California Petroleum company, the Murphy Oil company and others.

L. A. MIDWAY WILL SOON BEGIN WORK IN FIELD

The Los Angeles Midway Oil company will soon begin development work on its property in the Midway field. The eight-acre tract in section 32, 31-23, on the same anticline as the Standard, the Union, and the California oil companies, which was bought in some big deals.

DEVELOPMENTS NEAR LAKEVIEW

Activity in the region of the famous Lakeview is marked. Sage wells No. 10 and 11, which are in the northeast corner of section 35, are quite close to the Lakeview, have just painted the derrick, after having had several days of work on it. It is not known what the wells will do yet.

JACK RABBIT IS REVIVED

TUCSON, Ariz., Nov. 24.—The Jack Rabbit company has enlarged its boiler capacity at the Jack Rabbit mine in the Catalina district and is preparing to extract and ship high grade silver ore. In the early part of the year, the original discoverer of the Jack Rabbit mine, shipped many carloads of ore therefrom that averaged 500 ounces of silver to the ton.

REPLACE PITTSBURGH HOIST

NEVADA CITY, Nov. 24.—No time is being lost in replacing the burned hoisting works at the Pittsburg mine. Managing Director Mack B. Kerr and President Joseph Weisbein got together the day after the fire and decided to immediately begin the work of providing a new galloway frame and building.

MIDWAY PREMIER RUNS WILD

BAKERSFIELD, Nov. 24.—Reports from the North Midway area on the production of the Midway Premier's gusher on section 3-23 are increasing daily. The gusher is now producing 100,000 barrels of oil per day and is expected to continue for several months.

LOST HILL PROSPECTORS MAKE SIX NEW STRIKES

Operators in the Lost Hills are still reticent about disclosing details of their strikes, but it is estimated on good authority the oil sand has been uncovered in at least six new places, and that light oil with quantities of gas has been struck at 400 feet in the southern part of township 27-23, several miles southeast of the Lost Hills town-site.

NOVEMBER PRODUCTION MAY SHOW A DECLINE

Oil Situation Improves, and Operators Are Optimistic as to the Future

While no accurate information is yet available as to the probable production and consumption of California oil in November, the consensus of opinion in well informed circles seems to be that there will be practically no change as compared to October.
