From New Market. NEW MARKET, TENN., November 12, 1875.

To the Editors of the Chronicle: Believing that an item or two from this place would be welcomed, we "dot" as follows:

A very interesting meeting has been in progress at the Presbyterian Church since the adjournment of the Synod last Saturday, conducted by the local preacher, Rev. L. R. Jones, assisted by Rev. Mr. McDonald. Mr. McDonald's sermons elicited comment and interest by all who heard him.

There is some excitement over the hog market now. We can hear of farmers who claim to have been offered as high as 63 cents gross, but have never yet been able to find the dealer who made such extravagant offers, and we fear that it is a "false alarm." Several hundred hogs have been sold and shipped out of Rocky Valley at 6 cents. This, we consider, a pretty fair price. However, we are willing, and would be glad to see the farmers realize the highest figures quoted, for when they have plenty of money, we all have some.

The marriage market has been right brisk in this neighborhood this fall, too. Two upper county gentlemen, one from Greene and the other from Washington, have made successful raids on two households in the vicinity of New Market, recently, returning with their rich trophies, followed by the good wishes of all who were best acquainted with them.

Some person or persons whose souls have evidently long withered in meanness, entered the M. E. Church burial grounds, a few nights ago and tore down and put in piles, all the tombstones, except three or four large ones, which were cemented in the base rocks. Although we regret to publish to the world that we have such mean, low down, unprincipled and heathenish characters in our community, we do so, for the public welfare requiring it. American Manufactures.

The exports of American manufactures are increasing. Boston, we read, is constantly sending off various quantities of cotton fabrics to England, China, Africa, South America, the British provinces, &c. Even to Manchester have Orchard brown cottons just been sent. Our goods are also being sent from New York to England, and the Manchester Examiner, of October 23d, says of them:

"The cloth is a 'medium,' that is, a cloth ranking in weight between a shirting and a domestic. It is of remarkable purity, neatness and lustre, and regards price we can only say that the agents for its sale report that it finds a market here with increasing favor, and that there is no appearance of the importation ceasing at present."

So far as the New York Bulletin is able to ascertain, the quantity of cotton goods exported within the last month is close upon 20,000 packages, and the bulk has gone to markets in which we have always had more or less foothold, but the remarkable feature about the shipments is their unusually large amount.

In this connection it may be mentioned that at a recent meeting of the Bradford (England) Chamber of Commerce the announcement was made that a merchant of that place was in the habit of buying American cotton goods, and that they were cheaper than those manufactured in Lancashire, and this was accompanied by the ominous statement that it was not an isolated instance, but a growing practice. Mr. Garnett, who gave the information, stated that his friend had told him that the American cottons were not only cheaper, but better than Lancashire goods; they were strong and durable, while those manufactured in Lancashire were laden with sizing. In addition to this, Mr. Mason, a very large manufacturer in Lancashire, in addressing a meeting of his work people, told them that he thought the importation of American cloths a formidable fact.—Baltimore Sun.
