MAKING PREPARATION FOR MEETING TUESDAY

Preparations are now under way for the big mass meeting that is to be held by the Chamber of Commerce Tuesday, July 29. This meeting will have as its chief attraction Homer D. Wade of Stamford. Mr. Wade is recognized as the premier of secretaries for commercial bodies and comes here upon the invitation of President Fuqua of the Amarillo Chamber of Commerce.

Just what other business will demand attention on that occasion is not stated, but it is known that campaign plans and other matters will be considered either after or before the meeting Tuesday night. This visit of Mr. Wade is in compliance with and following a promise made by Mr. Penick of Stamford who stated that the secretary would be gladly released for sufficient time to come to Amarillo and remain a day or two.

Already approximately seven hundred names have been added to the rolls of the Chamber of Commerce and the hope has frequently been expressed that the total might be made at least one thousand over all. It is probable that this matter of membership will be considered as a part of the business rightly to come before the meeting Tuesday night, or at some meeting to be held soon thereafter.

PAT STEWART GETS MAXIMUM SENTENCE

In the case of the State of Texas vs. Pat Stewart, in which the defendant stood charged by indictment with engaging in the business of a liquor dealer in local option territory, the jury brought in a verdict of guilty yesterday forenoon and assessed the punishment at a term of five years in the penitentiary.

Mr. Stewart has heretofore been convicted on a charge of making sales of intoxicating liquors in local option territory, and in connection therewith received sentences of one year in each case.

The conviction yesterday forenoon was the first in which the maximum punishment has been visited by a jury. The case will be appealed if new hearing shall be denied by the court. The two other cases in which convictions resulted have already been appealed by counsel for the defendant.

BILL GOOSOE TAKES TWO YEARS IN PEN

Bill Goosoe is the first man to be convicted in Potter county upon a charge of conducting a business as a dealer in intoxicating liquors since prohibition became effective in this territory, and was given two years in the penitentiary. At the time of conviction it was presumed that motion for new trial would be made, but this was not done, the defendant concluding that he would take the punishment assessed in view of a promise to dismiss other cases of a similar nature against him.

Upon motion of District Attorney Bishop to dismiss the cases against Goosoe, the prisoner appeared in court yesterday morning and received the two-year sentence, and will be removed to the state prison within a reasonably short time.

The dismissal of these cases against Goosoe will diminish to a considerable extent the numbers in this division of the criminal docket, and will also obviate the effect of stopping the investigation of the grand jury charges in which it is alleged that violations of the class indicated have occurred.


