AUTO OWNERS ROUSED BY NEW TAXING BILL

A bill in the Texas legislature, which provides for a tax of from \$10 to \$25 on autos in the state, has aroused the State Association to aggressive action. A telegram was received yesterday by Frank A. White from C. H. Verschoyle, Secretary of the Texas Automobile Association, who suggested that a local club be formed in Amarillo, and that the membership fees be forwarded to the state organization to help defray expenses of a representative, who would appear in behalf of the association and auto owners, before the legislature in an effort to defeat the measure. The entrance fee, as stated by the message, is one dollar, which assures in addition, membership in the national association. Mr. White will present the matter to a number of auto owners of Amarillo, and action as suggested by Mr. Verschoyle, may be taken.


