## TEXAS RESOURCES NOT WIDELY KNOWN

tion for the settlers coming from the Northwest, North, and Northeast who have too often been told by grasping land agents they could grow, and largely in the same manner in the Panhandle, the same products they had been producing in Indiana, Illinois, Missouri, and Iowa.

With settlers from Texas as neighbors, the settlers from the other States would catch the spirit of determination and adaptation, would succeed and in doing so themselves remain permanent, and attract a constant stream of new settlers from their old home districts in the other states. I know these statements are true, because I have seen some of the foremost counties of Texas developed precisely along these lines.

Some four years ago the vice president of one of the large banks in Dallas was in Amarillo, to look over a certain proposition with a view to an investment, and also furnishing the proposition some money. In the course of the negotiations he stated that he did not feel certain as to the future of the country, and further stated that he had not been favorably impressed with what he saw from the train on the way up, and that he had been led to conclude that the Panhandle was just about what it had been represented to be. The gentlemen with whom the negotiations were being conducted brought the Dallas capitalist into my office, and it so happened that we had known each other in former years.

I had him sit down and placed before him some fifteen or twenty telegrams, ordering perhaps 30 to 50 cars of Panhandle grain and hay, a part of which was for Dallas, his home city, and others for Lancaster, Van Alstyne, McKinney, Waxahatchie, Ennis, Corsicana, and other points, none of which perhaps exceeded in distance 75 miles from Dallas.

I laid before him my order book, and he turned page after page, from 30 to 60 days, seeing entered therein orders for perhaps 100 cars, all told, for Indian corn, to be shipped from Shamrock, Meleon, Canadian and Glazier, and 200 to 300 cars of Kaffir, Mate, Wheat and Hay, from all over the Panhandle, and all going to points within a radius of 75 to 100 miles from Dallas, and many of the cars to Dallas proper, and a great many of the drafts covering these cars were cleared through his bank

in Dallas, and still he did not know though he was a native Texan, and had lived in Texas all his life, that the Panhandle could produce anything at all. I also pointed out to him that my firm was only one of several established in Amarillo, and engaged in the same line of business and that there were large firms likewise in forty or fifty important shipping points in the Panhandle, and that all shipments were being made to Texas points and mainly to points tributary to Dallas.

This exhibition and statement convinced him. He desired to know how many years this had been going on, and on being told stated that the period of production was long enough to establish the safety and security, and that with its many millions of acres of fertile agricultural lands, the Panhandle was bound to be one of the greatest sections of the United States, and suffice it to say, he made the investment and also granted the loan desired, and has been from that day to this an ardent booster of the Panhandle, and this would be the case with Texans everywhere throughout the State if they could only be shown, as they will be, through the instrumentality of the "All-Panhandle Fair," and the next issue of this story will prove this fact conclusively and overwhelmingly.
