Details of Norfleet's Thrilling Experience Told DEAD, THREE

HALE COUNTY MAN SPRUNG TRAP JAILING 33 CROOKS

J. Frank Norfleet of Hale Center, former sheriff of Hale County was in Amarillo yesterday after having gone through one of the most thrilling ex-periences in his life in Denver a few days ago. He was tocked up with a band of crooks for three nights and two days and did not dare to sleep for fear that his life would be taken.

A short time ago Mr. Norfleet left his home for Denyer to see parties about trading his ranch. He stopped off in Colorado Springs on his way to Denver and while in the former place he learned Quat efforts were being made to get evidence on a gaug of stock gamblers

After disposing of his business in Denver, he went to Phillip Van Cise, district attorney August 18, and learned of troubles that officers had in get ting evidence on the crooks. In the meantime, Norfleet had hopes of finding Charles G. Harris, alias W. D. Spencer, the last of the gang that fleeced him out of \$45,000 a few years ago and who has not yet been captured.

BONUS TO BE PAID BY 11-BILLION DOLLAR DEBT IS FAVORED BY SENATE

WASHINGTON, Aug. 29 .- Without a record vote, the senate today approved the use of the interest on the foreign debt in financing the soldiers' bonus. Also it substituted the Smith-McNary \$350,000,000 reclamation bill for the land settlement option in the house measure. Then it quit for the day with a final vote on the bonus measure at least one and perhaps two or three days distant.

The amendment authorizing the payment of the bonus charge with the interest on the eleven billion of dollars owed the United States by the allied nations was proposed by Senator Simmons, Democrat, North Carolina. He and Senator Reed, Missouri, and other members urged it as a means not only of meeting President Harding's requirement that the bill carry a means of financing, but also of silencing the talk about the cancellation of the foreign debt. A roll call on the proposal was demanded at first, but this demand was withdrawn, presumably because of the apprehension of leaders that a quorum could not be obtained at the then late hour.
