A TRIBUNE scribe went through a brewery process with Mr. Fred Miller, of Milwaukee, Monday. He was taken through all the vats and fermenters and cooling houses and malt houses, and given a pretty clear idea of how beer is made.

The buildings will be something immense and will give to the river landing a more business-like appearance. The ice house will be 43x118 feet, seven stories high, the barley elevator and storage house 22x49 feet six stories high; the malt house 49x96 feet, four stories high; the brewing house 39x86 feet, four stories high. These various departments occupying the space designated, will be in one massive brick building, near which the solid brick residence of the superintendent is now being built.
