Much to our regret we were forced to shoten as well as omit much news this week as machine troubles put us badly behind.

There is much complaint among the coal operators that the public is not buying coal as it should and that suffering is sure to result next winter if the present buyers strike is not broken.

The operators have robbed the people so long by excessive prices that it is very painful to them for the public to make even a mild resistance.

The coal operators know very well how to stimulate coal buying. They know if they will employ the methods other merchants and producers have employed, that of reducing prices, the people will begin to buy.

They are running on short time to attempt to starve the miner into taking a less price for mining coal when they could easily sell all the mines could produce if the price was made reasonable. There is not the slightest reason for asking the miner to take less for his labor to enable the operators to sell coal for a reasonable price.

Go to the operators with a proposition to reduce their salaries in the same proportion that they think the miner should reduce what he gets and see what the swivel chair force will say. They will decline to consider the situation at once.
 The government should take that gentry in hand, prosecute a few of them and send a few of them to Leavenworth or Atlanta for a few years and coal prices will immediately come down. There never has been a more wanton set of proleeters than the coal operators and they seem determined to keep up their robbery game just as long as the government will permit it.
 The patient and long-suffering public is entitled to relief from excessive coal prices at once.
