


H. M. AIKEN ANNOUNCES FOR CITY COMMISSIONER

SPY TURNED OUT OF BRITAIN

Ignatius Triblich Lincoln Deported After Serving Sentence for Forgery.

London, Aug. 13.—Ignatius Triblich Lincoln, former member of parliament, has been deported. He had been in prison here since 1914.

(Lincoln formerly was an American subject, but became a naturalized citizen of England. On August 4, 1915, he was arrested in Brooklyn, N. Y., on a charge of forgery preferred by the British consul in New York. Lincoln then declared he was a German spy and that England wanted him for that offense. Extradition of Lincoln on the forgery charge was ordered by the United States district court. He was deported on May 27, 1916. He was tried for forgery in London and sentenced to three years' imprisonment. Early in the year his certificate of British naturalization was revoked. A dispatch from London, under date of July 3, said that Lincoln would be deported to Hungary.)

FORD LIBEL SUIT NEAR END

Judge Tucker Expects to Charge Jury on Thursday—Arguments in Case Ended.

Mount Clemens, Mich., Aug. 13.—Arguments in the \$1,000,000 libel suit of Henry Ford against the Chicago Tribune closed with the summing up addresses of Elliott G. Stevenson, senior counsel for the Tribune, and Alfred Lucking, senior counsel for Mr. Ford. Judge Tucker said he intended to excuse the jury today while he devoted himself to preparing his instructions. Thursday morning, he said, he expected to charge the jury.

Medal for War on Yellow Fever.

Guayaquil, Ecuador, Aug. 13.—Doctor Connor, chairman of the commission sent here by the Rockefeller foundation, was presented with a gold medal on the success of the campaign against yellow fever in the region of Guayaquil.

Liquor Valued at \$10,000 Confiscated.

Cleveland, O.—Nine men were arrested and \$10,000 worth of liquor confiscated when John Sawkin, special agent of the Department of Justice, halted two trucks, which were carrying the liquor into Ohio from Pennsylvania when near Youngstown. One truck was loaded with 120 cases of beer, and the other with 100 cases of beer and two barrels of whisky.
