


# H. M. AIKEN ANNOUNCES FOR CITY COMMISSIONER

### N. Y. STRIKE OVER; PROBE ON

Prosecutors Take Up Charges Made by Mayor Hylan of Plot to Advance Fares.

New York, Aug. 20.—With the two-day strike of the 14,000 employees of the Interborough Rapid Transit company at an end, and normal traffic resumed on subway and elevated lines, attention was centered on investigations as to the cause of the strike. District Attorney Swann of New York county and Martin of the Bronx continued their investigations of charges made by Mayor Hylan that the strike had been due to collusion between officials of the company and leaders of the brotherhood for the purpose of forcing an increase in fares from 5 to 8 cents. The strikers obtained a 25 per cent increase, half what they asked.

### ASK BOYS BACK FROM SIBERIA

Delegates of 5,000 Relatives Go to Washington to Appeal to President Wilson.

Washington, Aug. 20.—Delegates representing more than 5,000 fathers, mothers, wives, sisters and sweethearts are on their way to Washington to appeal to President Wilson for the return of 4,000 soldiers who are in service in Siberia. The boys are members chiefly of the 27th and 31st Infantry regiments and have been away from their homes for nearly two years. The delegates were given a sendoff last night by several members of the Siberian expedition auxiliary. Mrs. Katherine Alexander, vice-president of the organization, declared that she would sit on the White House steps until she got an answer from the president.

### MRS. R. C. VANDERBILT SUES

Wife Asks Divorce From Cornelius Vanderbilt's Youngest Son—Charges Desertion.

Newport, R. I., Aug. 20.—Mrs. Cathleen (Nelson) Vanderbilt has begun divorce proceedings against her husband, Reginald C. Vanderbilt of New York, by having legal service made or him at his farm in Portsmouth. Mrs. Vanderbilt alleges desertion and will ask for the custody of their only child, a daughter, Cathleen. Mr. and Mrs. Vanderbilt were married 16 years ago. He is the youngest son of the late Cornelius Vanderbilt.
