SOME NEW LAWS.

Acts That Have Been Approved by President Dole.

President Dole signed four acts while rusticating on Hawaii, and they were returned as laws of the Republic on the Kinau yesterday. One is a law to promote the objects of the Bishop Museum and provides for the free importation of all books, and also for the free importation of alcohol which is to be used in the preservation of specimens.

Another act is one passed to amend Section 2 of Act 4 of the laws passed to provide for a labor commission.

The third act is one authorizing the Minister of Finance to pay \$52.20 to John F. Colburn for balance of salary due him.

The fourth act is one providing that the Minister of the Interior, with the approval of the Executive Council, shall have power to grant and allow amendments to all existing Charters of Incorporation. A significant clause in this law is the following: Section 2. All amendments to existing Charters of Incorporation, or Articles of Association heretofore allowed and granted are hereby declared void.
