WHARF AND WAVE.

The American bark Fresno left in ballast for Port Townsend yesterday morning. Firewood of the big ship Tillie Starbuck, from Astoria, encumbers the Nuuanu street wharf.

Pall, a harmless old pupae native, was busy gathering rice grains from the floor on the Fort street wharf last night.

The Oceanic liner Mariposa, with a big list of passengers and a small lot of island produce, sailed for San Francisco yesterday at 2 o'clock.

The Mail wharf is filled with bananas and empty beer kegs waiting for the Canadian liner Miowera, now overdue from the Colonies for Vancouver.

The steamer Iwalani brought a cargo of sugar from Hamakua for Schaefer & Co. yesterday morning, which was discharged on the schooner Transit and ship Commodore. She returned thence the same afternoon.

The American bark Matilda, with a cargo of lumber for Allen & Robinson, docked off Allen street yesterday morning, 23 days from Port Townsend. Captain Swenson brought his family along for a visit to Hawaii.

Captain Garland weighed anchor off the harbor yesterday morning on the missionary steamer Morning Star for a second attempt to reach Ruk. Harry Swinton has taken the place of the mate who was incapacitated by dementia and left at the hospital here.

Ocean Germs. The result of the Plankton expeditionary investigations prove that ocean germ life capable of reproduction exists everywhere except at the greatest ocean depths, and that it is more prolific in the Canary, Florida, and Labrador waters than in the north or south equatorial currents.

Bacterial life has been found at depths of 1300 to 3500 feet. The major portion is of those species requiring oxygen for their existence, a great number of which are also phosphorescent. The researches of M. Boutan also show that photographs of animal and vegetable life were obtained by him at considerable depths. The great value of these photographs consists in the fact that living organisms found at great depth and that cannot be brought to the surface for examination without mutilation are shown therein.

FEAT OF A KANAKA DIVER.

Plunged Full Ten Fathoms and Freed the John D. Spreckels' Anchor.

The Presence of Sharks Had no Terrors for Him and He Seemed to Think the Task Easy.

Had it not been for the skill and endurance of a kanaka diver, the chances are that the barkentine John D. Spreckels, which plies between this port and the Hawaiian Islands, would have had to sacrifice a costly anchor and chain while at Mahukona recently, says the S. F. Examiner of June 1st.

The vessel made her usual visit to that little harbor and, having discharged her supplies and taken on considerable sugar, tried to take her departure. The seamen found, however, that the anchor had become fast to the rocks at the bottom and they could not dislodge it. They waited for the turn of several tides, and still they could not free the anchor.

Captain Christensen did not want to lose the anchor, and yet that seemed to be the only way out of the predicament. At last a happy thought struck him. He sent ashore for a kanaka who was reputed to be a skillful diver, and when a bargain with him to release the anchor, lying in several fathoms of water, this did not seem to bother the kanaka in the least, however, and he plunged overboard for a reconnoitering tour. He was gone about two minutes and then returned to the surface to report that the anchor was clinging to a conical-shaped boulder and would have to be dragged away from it. One of the sailors warned the diver to be on his guard as several sharks had been seen in the vicinity. The fellow only grinned.

"Sharks no bite kanaka," he said, and then started for the bottom again, after giving instructions to have the chain slackened. This time the diver was gone nearly three minutes, says Captain Christensen. By the time he returned to the surface the rapid drifting of the vessel told those on board that the anchor had been released. The captain says the anchor was by no means a light one and he is still wondering how the kanaka could handle it and yet survive in that depth of water.
