The Mauna Loa will sail for Maui

and Hawaii ports at 10 a. m. today. No freight will be received on the dock after 9 o'clock.

While in San Francisco George Greig of Fanning's Island chartered the schooner Viking to make a trip to the island with stores, etc.

It is very probable that the bark Andrew Welch will get away for San Francisco today. She has taken on her full cargo of sugar.

The four-masted schooner Nokomi, Captain Roos, arrived on Thursday last, 15 days from Mexico. The Nokomi will load sugar for San Francisco.—Hilo Herald of December 31.

In August last the steamer Kilauka Hon picked up a life buoy in the channel between Maui and Hawaii. The buoy was marked in Japanese characters, which denoted that it belonged to H. I. J. M. war-ship Banjo. Intelligence has been received that the buoy was lost from that vessel in 1894 off the coast of Honou.

The Japanese steamer Sakura-Marui, Brady master, arrived in port yesterday morning, 15 days from Seattle with reports of fine weather. She has neither freight nor passengers for this port, but stopped to load 200 tons of coal. She has 22 Japanese, 67 Chinese and 3 through European stowage passengers. The Sakura-Marui will get away today at 4 p. m.

The O. S. S. Monowai, Carey commander, arrived in port yesterday noon, after a pleasant voyage from the Colonies. Following is Pursor Bendall's report: Left Sydney on December 21st at 4:30 p. m. and arrived in Auckland on December 25th at 10 p. m. Left Auckland next day at 2:15 p. m.; reached Apia on the 30th, at 4:30 p. m.; made a stay of 10 hours and arrived in Honolulu as above.
