WHARF AND WAVE.

DIAMOND HEAD SIGNAL STATION, May 2, 10 p. m. The weather is cloudy; wind, light, N.E.
The Doric Chinamen were released from quarantine Saturday.
The Mikahala will sail for Lahaina at 10 a. m. and the Ke Au Hou for Kahuku at 3 p. m.
The bark Alden Besse is alongside the Mauna Loa, at the Inter-Island wharf, taking sugar.
Captain Fitzgerald left on the Lehua Saturday to lay the stern moorings at Honomu for that steamer.
James Lyle left for Hilo on the Helene Saturday to attend to the leak, recently found in the ship Indiana, now at that port.
The schooner Robert Lewers and the barkentine Irmgard should be here in about a week. They loaded together in San Francisco.
The bark C. D. Bryant, Colly master, sailed in ballast for Layson Island and after a cargo of guano for H. Hackfeld & Co., Saturday.
The R. P. Rithet, with Captain Thompson, formerly of the S. C. Allen, in charge, will be in port very soon. She left San Francisco on April 21st.
The Claudine arrived early Sunday morning with 5,550 bags of sugar, 24 head of cattle, 82 hogs and 103 hides, together with island products of various kinds.
The schooner Transit has finished discharging her cargo of general merchandise. She has 5,000 bags of sugar on already, and will haul over to the Kinau wharf to take on 5,840 bags more. She needs about 16,000 bags, and will be ready to sail on or about Thursday.
The American 4-masted schooner W. H. Talbot, Bluhm master, arrived in the harbor Saturday morning after a run of 55 days from Westport, N. Z., with a cargo of 12,814 tons of coal consigned to the Inter-Island Company. Very contrary weather was met with for most of the trip.
The American barkentine S. N. Castle, Hubbard master, arrived in port before breakfast time Saturday, 12 1/2 days from San Francisco, with a cargo of 800 tons of general merchandise. Strong winds during the greater part of the trip and light winds during the last four days were reported by the skipper.
The three-masted schooner Oceania Vance, Manson master, arrived in port early yesterday afternoon, 59 days from Newcastle, with a cargo of 618 tons of coal to order. Mean weather was met with nearly all the way up. The Oceania Vance passed Tahiti April 5th, and was the balance of the time getting to Honolulu. On Thursday she was to the leeward of Hawaii, when a calm set in. It became necessary to lower all the sails on account of the violent rocking of the vessel.

IN THE MATTER OF THE DISSOLUTION AND DISINCORPORATION OF THE PAUKAA SUGAR COMPANY.

TO ALL TO WHOM THESE PRESENTS SHALL COME, I, JAMES A. KING, Minister of the Interior of the Republic of Hawaii, send greeting:—
WHEREAS, on the 5th day of February, A. D. 1897, the Paukaa Sugar Company, a corporation existing under the laws of the Hawaiian Islands, presented to the Minister of the Interior, a petition together with a Certificate setting forth that at a meeting of its Stockholders called for that purpose, it was decided by a vote of over three-fourths of the said Stockholders to dissolve and disincorporate the said Corporation, which said Certificate was signed by J. E. Atherton, President, and George R. Carter, Secretary, the Presiding Officer and Secretary respectively of said meeting, which said Petition and Certificate were entered of Record in the Office of the Minister of the Interior.
AND WHEREAS, notice was there- after caused to be published in the English and Hawaiian languages for sixty days in the Semi-Weekly Hawaiian Gazette and the 12th day of February to the 9th day of April, 1897, in the Semi-Weekly Hawaiian Gazette and the 9th day of April, 1897, in the Nupepa Kuokoa and affidavits of the publication thereof have been presented to this Office and are annexed to the Original Petition and Certificate on file.
AND WHEREAS, I am satisfied that the vote therein certified was taken, and I am further satisfied that all claims against the said Paukaa Sugar Company have been paid and discharged.
NOW THEREFORE KNOW YE, That in consideration of the premises and no reason to the contrary appearing, I do hereby declare that the said Corporation, the PAUKAA SUGAR COMPANY, is hereby dissolved and that the surrender of its Charter dated October 20th, A. D. 1882, is hereby accepted on behalf of the Hawaiian Government.
