

Oahu College Alumni, uniting with those of Benicia Seminary and Mills College and others, joined in a very pleasant reunion and reception for Mrs. Mills, on the Punahou grounds Saturday afternoon. It was a notable gathering not soon to be forgotten. Although thirty-five years have passed since Dr. C. T. Mills and his wife resigned and went to California, yet few of their Punahou pupils have died, and of those in Honolulu many were present.

In a most felicitous manner Mrs. Mills reviewed their years of service at Punahou and joined the past with the present, reviewing many forgotten recollections of good times, and broad accomplishment. Her remarks were followed by others, from pupils here and elsewhere, all of whom gave grateful praise to the valuable and sympathetic work done. They have accomplished much on educational lines during nearly fifty years of splendid service; only now it is no longer they, for he has gone before, leaving the other still working, and each year adding more to the long list of those who will remember Mr. and Mrs. Mills with gratitude.
