SEWERAGE WORK

Work at Actual Construction to be Begun Next Week.

PREPARING FILTRATION PLANS

Material All to be Tested Before Being Used—Contractors Representatives Due on Coptic.

The work of actual construction on the sewerage system for Honolulu will begin next Monday. The contractors, Vincent & Belser, of San Francisco, will have representatives here in a few days. They are expected by the Coptic, due next Friday.

The work of actual construction will be begun first at the reservoir to be built in Kakaako. At the same time the work of excavation will be started at several points along the proposed route.

In the meantime Engineer Edwards, who was left in charge by Mr. Hering upon the latter's departure, and his assistant, W. K. Knowlton, civil engineer, are engaged in finishing all the preliminary work. In their office in Kapualwa building are great rolls of maps and plans. These show exactly where each spadeful of earth is to be turned and each length of pipe laid.

In addition to the drawings a good-sized building has been erected on the premises some distance to the rear of the fish market and quite an area of ground has been enclosed. Here will be stored all the material to be used, such as cement, piping, brick, etc. In the building the cement will be mixed and tested. Large quantities of cement and pipe, and the testing machines are already on the ground. From the present outlook before many days have passed Honolulu people will realize that the construction of their sewerage system is in progress.

In addition to the plans for the above work, Messrs. Edwards and Knowlton are devoting more or less time to the drawings for a filtration process. It will be remembered that some time ago Mr. Hering appeared before the Board of Health several times for the purpose of consulting with the members regarding filtration works. The result was that the Board passed a resolution recommending to the proper officials that a system of filtration of the water supply be established as soon as possible. The drawings made by the engineers are for the slow process which was commended by the Board.

Mr. Hering is in constant correspondence with his representatives in Honolulu. He is a very busy man as, on account of his wide reputation, he is constantly sought after. Only recently he was appointed consulting engineer for the new sewer system to be installed in San Francisco.

GOVERNOR LEARY.

The New York World says: "Leary, the fighting, jolly Leary, who goes to Guam as the first American Governor of an island possession, has a striking personality. Robert Louis Stevenson found in him the elements to suggest, in 'A Footnote to History,' a typical naval man, leavened with a certain quaint appreciation of the ridiculous that made him a charmingly blended mixture of fighter and humorist. Capt. Leary was in command of the gunboat Adams in 1888, when there was trouble in Samoa, and if he had been on the quarter-deck of a battleship, instead of a second-rate, unprotected gunboat like the Adams, he could not have shown greater independence than he did when the German naval force attempted to overawe him. No two countries ever came closer to war than America and Germany did then. One shot would have provoked it, and the men were at the guns, expecting that that shot would be fired. Stevenson, in his Samoan home, gasping for breath, and believing that the balm of the Pacific pines and the eucalyptus were bringing life to his inert lungs, wrote admiringly of Leary. He told of the American officer's keen wit and his ability to take advantage of an opportunity. In the charming tale of the seven years' trouble in Samoa, Capt. Leary stands out strongly."

TO LOCATE A SHIP.

Professor Marconi has invented an instrument for ascertaining a ship's position in a fog, when it is within range of one of the telegraph stations. It consists of a receiver, which can be revolved, and which, when pointing toward the transmitting station, sets off an electric bell, thus establishing the bearings as accurately as a compass can. The instrument is to be tried on the Channel steamers.
