FAME'S PATHWAY.

Carel Hendrick Kruger, nephew of the president of the Transvaal Republic, is a recent graduate of the Edinburgh University, where he won the Syme surgical scholarship.

Senator Berenger, who is giving special attention to the morals of Paris during the exposition, is president of the organizing committee of the International congress which considers the question of Sunday as a legally and socially recognized day of rest.

Thomas Bain, the new speaker of the lower house of the Canadian parliament, is of lanky build, 6 feet 2 inches in height, and looks like a typical rustic. This has gained for him the nickname of "Farmer." He speaks in the nasal, singsong way of Maine and Vermont backwoodsmen.




