WERE GUILTY POSTMASTERS

Lewis and Turk Fined Appointments of Several Received. Yesterday.

Heavenly Twins Convicted by Crimp McCarthy of Assault and Battery.

A large crowd from the waterfront assembled in Judge Wilcox's court yesterday to witness the trial of the shipping-masters, Lewis and Turk, charged with assault and battery on another shipping-master, J. McCarthy, whose right name is Gray, and who sometimes goes by the name of John Doe.

On one side of the court of justice sat the big tow-headed Irishman, McCarthy, with one eye on Lewis and the other on Turk. On the other side of the room were seated Messrs. Lewis and Turk, in natty attire and graceful poses.

Lewis, during his testimony, expressed surprise at McCarthy having gone for Turk hot and heavy after he, Lewis, had knocked him down; he supposed, however, that it was on account of McCarthy's optical peculiarity. This is one of McCarthy's misfortunes; he looks both ways at once, and this partially explains how it was that the Irishman got in so many blows on the well-dressed persons of Lewis and Turk during the little scrap they had together the other day.

Witnesses for the prosecution testified that Lewis struck the first blow. The three crimps were talking together when Lewis suddenly landed on McCarthy's mouth. Turk then put in some of his fine work and McCarthy hit the ground. Turk kicked McCarthy in the face as he lay prostrate, according to the testimony. Lewis made a motion to kick him, missed and fell sprawling. Then McCready took them all to the police station, where Lewis and Turk were charged with assault and battery.

The hearing of the case continued on into the afternoon. Many witnesses were called. Judge Wilcox, in rendering his decision, said that it was clearly a case of two men against one and that the testimony showed Lewis and Turk to be at fault. He spoke of the assertions of Lewis and Turk to the effect that McCarthy reached for his hip pocket as if to draw a gun, when, as a matter of fact, McCarthy carried his gun in the front part of his trousers. The sworn statements of several reputable witnesses who had talked with Lewis and Turk showed conclusively that the pair had said one thing in conversation outside the court room and another thing on the stand.

Lewis and Turk did not know whether McCarthy had a gun or not until he was searched at the police station. Their saying that the Irishman reached for his hip pocket when the gun was in front of him was evidently a sad error. Judge Wilcox, after a little speech on the wrong of fighting, fined Lewis and Turk each \$30 and costs. An appeal was noted.

Lewis and Turk were arrested yesterday morning charged with disturbing the quiet of the night. This complaint was sworn to by a sailor. The case of Lewis and Turk against McCarthy, charged with assault with a deadly weapon, was postponed until tomorrow morning.

Star Routes To Be Soon Established—Inspector Flint Will Leave Soon. By the Alameda yesterday Postoffice Inspector Flint received the commissions of seven postmasters of the presidential offices of the Islands. They are: William Hay, Honolulu, Hawaii. George Lawson, Honoapou, Hawaii. John H. Boie, Paipaiou, Hawaii. Christian Andrews, Hauula, Oahu. Joseph H. Mahoe, Pukoo, Molokai. John C. Sarle, Hilea, Hawaii. Rudolph Wassman, Napoopoo, Hawaii.

Orders were also received from the Postmaster General to advertise for bids for the star route mail service between a number of different points in the Islands. The three on which bids are to be asked at once are from Honolulu to Heela, a distance of twelve miles; from Hauula to Kahuku, six miles; from the Pall to Waimanalo, a distance of six miles. All these points are to have six times a week mail service.

Mr. Flint also received by the Alameda his orders to return to the Mainland, and with Inspector Hall he will leave on the next Australia, going to Los Angeles, where he will testify in a postal case which he worked up there some time ago. Mr. Flint will be succeeded by Inspector W. A. Robinson of San Francisco, who has been ordered to the Islands temporarily to replace Mr. Flint. It is not likely that Mr. Flint will return, as all of the work of installing the postal service in the Islands is practically completed and what remains to be done is largely in the nature of routine work.


