SAMPLE TRAMWAY SERVICE.

How Cars Wait for Each Other on Distant Switches.

Passengers using the Beretania street tramways have had considerable cause for complaint against the management during the past week. One of the principal kicks is against the long waits at switches for cars coming in the opposite direction. Last Saturday car No. 7 arrived at the switch in front of Dr. Wood's office and waited for four minutes for the opposite-going car. The driver remained there for nine minutes longer until a passenger inquired why he didn't drive on. He replied that he might meet the other car half way down Fort street and therefore didn't want any "pilkia." The passenger got out of the tram and walked down the street and at Hotel street met the "other" car just coming up. It turned out that each car was waiting for the other one and a delay was thereby caused along the entire line. It is a frequent occurrence to wait on switches anywhere from three to ten minutes for the "other" cars.
