YACHTSMEN MEET AND ASSOCIATE

Enthusiastic Proceedings at the Hawaiian Hotel Last Night. Over twenty of the local yachtsmen assembled in the basement of the Hawaiian Hotel last night for the purpose of forming an association.

The chairman stated that he understood that the yachtsmen had decided to cast aside their swaddling clothes of red and blue, and had met to organize independently. The following preliminary agreement was read:

"We, the undersigned residents of the island of Oahu, Territory of Hawaii, being interested in the sport of yachting, and desiring to encourage the sailing of yachts, do hereby associate ourselves and those hereafter to be associated into a yachting association under a name to be hereafter agreed upon, and under such a constitution and bylaws, rules and regulations as shall be hereafter agreed upon by a majority of members at a meeting to be held pursuant to five days' written notice by the secretary, elected at this meeting, Sept. 24th, 1901."
