CARNIVAL OF ASSAULT

There was a carnival of assault and battery cases in Judge Wilcox's court yesterday, and fines were as thick as flies around a jam foundry.

D. Espinda was charged with assault and battery on Mrs. E. Kinoolu. The complaining witness had evidently taken large doses of forgiveness powder, for she didn't want the court to do a thing to her assailant.

Thereupon the lady again besought the court to be merciful. Judge Wilcox remarked that when the mills of the law got to grinding they took considerable stopping. They ground \$5 and costs out of Espinda.

John Glinn, assistant chief of the fire department, was fined \$10 and costs for assault and battery on E. R. Durant, an ex-freeman. Durant was amusing himself kicking a horse, when Glinn told him that such action was unseemly.

M. Fairbanks and George Tingshom had a regular Fox-Agnew time of it. That is, they talked considerable and didn't hurt each other much. Alas, they had been friends in youth!

Not long ago Fairbanks borrowed some house furnishings from Tingshom, including a portiere which he hung on his lanai. Tingshom fancied that this was done to shut off the view from his house, and that it implied "abbering" on his part.

After a while Tingshom stationed himself in front of Fairbanks' house and challenged him to mortal combat, calling him names which don't appear in any standard work on nomenclature. Being a man of peace, Fairbanks, like the fraternal rodent, lay low.

The scene of the next act was at the Honolulu Iron Works, where the men got together and mixed it, no more worth mentioning being spilled in the operation.

Judge Wilcox told defendant that he who hesitates loses money. He said that if Tingshom had anything coming to him, Fairbanks should have delivered the goods on the spot, and not have wasted two or three days before assaulting him. The fine amounted to \$5 and costs.

PLANS FOR THE MURPHY UNION

A meeting of the directors and members of the Murphy Union was held at the hall on Bethel street last night. Among those present were Rev. Mr. Westervelt, Noyes Trombley, Major Wilson, Booles, Wallace and others.

The subject under discussion was the financial operations of the Union. A careful estimate of expenditures and receipts was made, and this will be used as a basis for future plans. Several of the members contributed liberally, but it was realized that a club of this nature was unable to go on without financial assistance from outside sources.

Mr. Westervelt agreed to see different individuals with regard to contributions of sufficient amounts to keep the club running for three months, after which the club's experimental stage will have passed. Geneva Arrives. The American brig Geneva, Captain Aas, arrived off port yesterday afternoon, and was towed into the harbor by the Fearless. It was dark when she went to the Irrigard wharf, where she is now lying. She made the trip from San Francisco to this port in sixteen days. In San Francisco it was found impossible to get a white crew, so Japanese were shipped as sailors. The Geneva brings a lot of stock on deck, among which are 157 hogs.

Lansing. Justice, James H. McLeary Texas, associate justice Supreme Court of Porto Rico. In the Navy Leary M. Garrett, lieutenant commander; George W. Jungen, lieutenant commander; George Brice, lieutenant junior grade.

Commenting on Russian acquisition of Manchuria Moscow journalists show that England demanded the keeping open of the southern ports, forcing the Russians into holding possession. A dispatch from Christiania reports that ex-Premier Sibbern is dead. The Knickerbocker Sugar Refining Co. will erect a \$1,500,000 refinery at Edgemere, N. J. Sousa's band has had a great reception in London. Ann Adelia Doss De Barr, a notorious criminal, is under arrest in London on a charge of swindling by clairvoyance and Spiritualism. Sensational disclosures, affecting some of England's nobility, are looked for at the trial. Japan wants a loan of \$25,000,000 gold from the United States. Chauncey Depew announces his forthcoming marriage to Miss Palmer. The Schley inquiry is continued, the principal portion of the time of the court being taken up in the wrangling of counsel over admissibility of correspondence and details of distances of ships off shore.
