Mr. Macfarlane, who is at present staying at Ahuhimani, stated last night that the present stormy weather on the Koolau coast had prevented all attempts to float the schooner or even to ascertain the extent of the damage. As soon as the stormy weather has abated, however, attempts will be made to float the schooner, as Mr. Macfarlane does not think that she is much damaged.


