



SUDDEN DEATH OF JOHNSON NICKIUS OF HILO--HIS CAREER

After an illness lasting only two days, Johnson Nickieus, the Hilo attorney, died in the Queen's Hospital Thursday night, his death being due to an acute attack of diabetes. Mr. Johnson came to Honolulu Saturday from Hilo on the Kinaiu to attend the present session of the Supreme Court, where he has a number of important cases pending. He was not feeling well when he arrived, although he argued one case before the Supreme Court on Monday. Tuesday he complained of illness, and that same evening was conveyed to the hospital. His death was a surprise to his friends.

None of his family were present at the time, his wife having gone east about four weeks ago to visit a married daughter, the wife of a cartoonist in New York city. An unmarried daughter, who is engaged to Mr. Robert Haxhurst, of Hilo, is at present in that place, but owing to the wireless telegraph system being out of order, she cannot be reached from here until the departure of one of the Island boats next Tuesday. It is not known whether Mr. Nickieus wrote his daughter on last Tuesday's boat concerning his illness. If he did it is possible his daughter may arrive here tomorrow from Hilo.

Mr. Nickieus was prominent in the political affairs of the State of Washington, and was one of its best known attorneys. He was for some time previous to his coming to the Islands, a consular representative of the United

States in Bolivia or Peru. He was always a Republican, and was a prominent factor in matters concerning the party in the States of Washington and North Dakota. He served two terms as mayor of Tacoma, Wash.

Previous to his residence in Washington, he resided in Jamestown, N. D. Mr. J. C. Evans, of Honolulu, who knew Mr. Nickieus there, says he was for three terms a member of Territorial Senate during the period when the two Dakotas were one, and he was also a member of the constitutional convention of North Dakota after the division into North Dakota and South Dakota. He was intensely interested in the fight to carry the capital to Bismark from Yankton, in which fight he was aided by Alex Mackenzie, who has lately figured in Alaskan politics. He was mentioned as a candidate for the governorship of North Dakota, but did not press his claims for such political recognition.

Mr. Nickieus came to the Hawaiian Islands on account of ill health, and upon locating at Hilo was admitted to practice in all the courts of the Territory, in September, 1900. He was a native of the District of Columbia, and was fifty-one years of age.

No definite arrangements have yet been made for his funeral, as advices will be awaited from his daughter in Hilo. The local order of Elks, of which the deceased was a member, have taken charge of the remains and will arrange the details of interment later.

demand for the overturning of everything that has its roots in Hawaiian history and substituting for it the nebulous something that for want of clear conception or definiteness is called "Americanism." But he has not set on foot any tangible movement for changes suitable to conditions. He has not inspired confidence. Comparatively few even of those who desire definite changes conformable to new conditions, follow him. Outside of Honolulu and to a limited extent of Hilo, he has no partisans or supporters. The great body of the public that interests itself in public matters from any other than the standpoint of personal benefit, do not endorse his methods, though many of them do approve some of the things he advocates. Governor Dole, though conservative, too conservative in some things, is recognized as having a broad grasp on the means by which, and the conditions under which, changes to be beneficial must come. He has shown constructive ability of a high order, and he has the confidence of the people.
