WANT PLAN MADE KNOWN

M'Kinley Memorial Committee Is Ready.

MONEY WILL BE SOUGHT AT ONCE

Point Made That Subscriptions Will Follow Declaration as to Form of Monument.

Whereas, it appears to the members of this committee that the work of securing subscriptions would be facilitated by definite knowledge as to the form of memorial to be erected, therefore, be it

Resolved, that the executive committee be requested to take positive action regarding the character of the memorial.

In the resolution quoted the Oahu committee of the McKinley memorial organization embodied its sentiment in connection with the memorial fund situation. The meeting of the sub-committee for this island, held at the office of Chairman H. Waterhouse, was attended by that officer, Secretary Farrington, Messrs. Chamberlain and Marques.

There was some discussion as to the course to be followed in the getting down to work upon the collection of the funds. Mr. Chamberlain suggested that in his opinion the first step should be the preparation of a list of perhaps a hundred men who would be expected to subscribe \$100 each. This could be cut up and the members of the committee could then see a certain number of the men and secure a good start for the fund. After this preliminary there could be arranged lists for private subscriptions, at public places, and in this way the sum of \$15,000 or more might be collected.

Mr. Marques said that among the Portuguese people with whom he had talked, he had found that there was a disposition to ask how the money was to be used. He thought there would be many subscriptions, though, of course, they would not be heavy ones, from the Portuguese.

This sentiment being echoed by the chairman, Mr. Farrington offered the resolution which is quoted, and when it passed there was some discussion as to the sentiment of the committee upon the form of the monument or memorial to be erected. The members of the committee all favored some plan for a park or playground. The committee adjourned until Monday afternoon at 3:30 o'clock, when it is hoped to have a full meeting, so that plans for use during the holidays may be matured.

EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE WORK.
The McKinley Memorial executive committee met yesterday afternoon in the office of C. M. Cooke, there being present Governor Dole, J. A. McCandless, F. A. Schaefer, T. Olive Davies, C. M. Cooke and Secretary Hawes. The request of the Oahu committee for more committeemen was granted, the following being added: J. A. McCandless, Andrew Brown, Miss Felker, Mrs. Frasher, Principal Dyke of Kamehameha Schools, President Smith of Oahu College, and the Rev. Alexander Mackintosh.

A letter was received, with several photographs, showing the plans of Rupert Schmid, the Oakland sculptor, for a monument. The design was first offered to Los Angeles, but it was too expensive for that city. The cost will be between \$25,000 and \$30,000. The design is a departure in that instead of the figure of McKinley posed upon a pedestal, there is a seated figure of Columbia, at the top, the figure of McKinley below, he being represented in the act of descending the steps about the monument. This permits some action in the figure. About the shaft there are historical symbolical groups. The design is to be carried out in granite or sandstone, with figures in bronze. The letter was placed on file. In the room were three designs made by Sculptor Usburne, the local artist, which received much favorable comment.

MIXED, BUT IN EARNEST.
A negro recruit and the officer of the day figure in the following little story from the Philippines, written home by a Kentucky volunteer:
"A negro recruit on outpost duty, who had been filled with stories of the Filipinos' torture of captured American soldiers, had let his mind run on them until his terror caused him to get his orders for the day into a pretty bad mess. At midnight the officer of the day went the rounds. When he struck this 'rooky' he was challenged by a scared negro.
"Halt, dah; who's dat?"
"The answer was: 'Officer of the day.'
"Again the sentry sung out: 'Halt, dah; who's dat?'
"The officer then asked him what in Sand Hill was the matter? Why didn't he know his orders? The negro said: 'I does know mah orders.'
"Well, what are they?' asked the officer, and to his surprise the answer came back:
"De sargent done tole me to halt you three times and den shoot you.' And with that he cocked his rifle.
"You should have seen that officer sprint for a tree. From there he used the only argument of any avail with a cool. He cussed him so hard that the negro forgot all about shooting him. Half an hour later the officer was able to come out from his hiding place and give his proper orders."—Louisville Courier-Journal.

WILL BE APPEALED

Pearl Harbor Case Goes to Ninth Circuit.

By a stipulation filed yesterday, the Bishop estate is given thirty days in which to perfect an appeal to the Ninth Circuit Court of Appeals at San Francisco, from the verdict of the jury in the Pearl Harbor condemnation cases.

Jean Sabate was arrested yesterday on a charge of violating the United States postal laws. Sabate was taken before Commissioner Robinson and his bond fixed at \$2500.

While Sabate was a letter-carrier, it is alleged a man named Walker gave him a package to mail, together with twenty-five cents to pay the postage. Sabate neglected to mail the package, and upon a complaint, Postmaster Oat found the missing package, still unopened. Sabate denies criminal intent. The penalty for the offense is a maximum fine of \$500 or imprisonment for one year. Sabate has been unable to furnish bail.

The annual accounts of E. F. Bishop, trustee of the Hayselden estate, were approved yesterday and the master allowed a fee of \$34. The trustee's bond was increased from \$8,000 to \$35,000. The third annual account of Mrs. Isabella McC. Jones, guardian of the Jones minors, was approved. Atkinson and Judd were allowed a fee of \$25 as attorneys.

Kamila Kuhia was appointed administrator of the estate of Alonzo Kuhia, deceased, and is to file a bond of \$1500 within five days.

The Hawaiian Hardware Company has filed the Kamala Sugar Company for \$128,741, with interest at 6 per cent from February 20th, 1901.

Elizabeth K. Wilder has begun suit in ejectment against J. O. Carter and the other trustees of the Bishop estate. The property in dispute is situated at Waikiki, and contains an area of 605 square feet.

The assumed suit of Kan Ting Kee vs. Yim You was dismissed yesterday.

Wade Warren Thayer, trustee in bankruptcy of C. T. Amann, wants the testimony of that individual taken before he leaves the Territory. The trustee is about to bring suit against A. Lidgate of Paunilo to recover \$1765, and to recover the sum of \$800 alleged to have been received by Bishop & Co.
