READY TO SING THE MESSIAH

Philharmonic Society Production of the Oratorio at Pauahi Hall.

The first ambitious performance of Handel's "Messiah" will be given at Pauahi Hall, Oahu College, this evening, under the direction of Professor Ballaseyus, musical director of the institution, by the Philharmonic Society. The solo soprano parts will be sung by Mrs. Geneva Johnstone Bishop, of Chicago, who is expected to arrive today for the purpose of appearing in this production.

The society, young, but energetic, which will essay the oratorio, will have in its chorus something like seventy-five voices, and will furnish the other soloists. There will be, too, an orchestra of fifteen pieces, and this will be supplemented by a piano and the grand organ, to use which, primarily, the hall was selected. As there has entered into the preparation of this performance the most thorough and conscientious work, and the direction will be that of one completely familiar with the entire oratorio, the treat offered will be a rare one in itself.

There are in the oratorio many exceedingly fine passages, the soloists each having numbers which are of the highest rank, primarily for the soprano and the bass, the tenor role being perhaps the least grateful. The grand chorus, the "Hallelujah," written as it was for a small chorus, and never sung during the life of the composer by more than two dozen voices, will be given a rendition which will be a revelation to admirers of this music, who have never heard it with orchestra and organ and such a chorus as is now proposed.

The frequent rehearsals have put the chorus in good trim for the heavy work which is expected of them, and the local soloists have received the highest praise from those who have heard the rehearsal productions. The soloists other than Mrs. Bishop are, alto, Miss Ethel Cameron; tenor, Loyal H. Miller; bass, Frederick Melchers. In the chorus will be heard: Sopranos-Mrs. Isabel Davis, Mrs. J. Leitch, Mrs. G.
