



WATERFRONT NEWS

BIG CARGO FROM HAWAII

The Steamer Mauna Loa Brings a Big Cargo From Kau and Kona.

Inter-island trade is "picking up" in smaller farmers' lines if the big cargo brought into port on Tuesday morning from Kona and Kau ports is any criterion, but the sugar carrying for this season is almost ended. The season for vegetables and bananas is now coming on and the island boats should bring in a lot of such cargo during the next few weeks from the other islands for the Honolulu market.

The greater portion of the Mauna Loa's cargo consisted of 9600 bags of sugar; 4300 bags were for C. Brewer & Co., and 4700 for W. G. Irwin & Co. The remainder of her cargo consisted of 52 sacks of coffee, 45 sacks of awa, 405 sacks of taro, 115 bunches of bananas, 36 kegs of butter, 36 cases of fruits, 11 pigs, eight barrels of poi, 30 head of cattle and 1177 packages of sundries. Among the items classed as sundries there were a number of crates of vegetables, including some very fine sabbages.

Because of the ending of the sugar season another one of the island steamers may be laid up next week.

Purser Simerson says that the banana yield on Hawaii this season will be a big one and the crop is of a very good quality.

WILL BE EXTRA MAIL TO COAST

Oil-Burner Steamer Nevada Off to San Francisco on Saturday.

Honolulu will have an extra mail to the coast this week, as the oil-burner Nevada will sail for San Francisco at 4 p. m. on Saturday, with mail and a big cargo of sugar and bananas. As the Nevada is to go direct to the coast she will arrive there so that orders for merchandise may be filled in time to be sent out to Honolulu by the next steamer.

The Nevada is now loading at Kaula, and is expected to arrive here Friday morning, when she will receive additional cargo at the Railway wharf.

The Nevada's cargo of bananas will consist of a very large number of bunches, the amount to go by her totaling some 4000 bunches. The American-Hawaiian Steamship Company is doing everything in its power to foster the banana trade between Honolulu and the coast.

Want to Go to Laysan Island.

There were many sailors along the waterfront yesterday who expressed a desire to go with the island steamer which will start to the relief of the Japs on Laysan Island and on the search for the bark Ceylon. The sailor always has a desire to see out-of-the-way places, and Laysan Island is certainly a point to which but few sailors have been.

Mikahala Being Overhauled.

The steamer Mikahala is tied up at the Inter-Island wharf, where she is undergoing an extensive overhauling. Repairs are being made to her boilers and six feet will be added to her smoke-stack to insure a better draft. The paint has all been scraped from her hull and she will be caulked and painted. She will probably be laid up for three weeks.

Fight News by the Peru.

The Pacific Mail liner Peru was timed to leave San Francisco at 1 p. m. on August 1, and would have six days' later news for Honolulu. She is expected to arrive Thursday night and will have full accounts of the fight. The Alameda did not expect to sail from the coast until a day later.

Shipping Notes.

The schooner Okanagan is discharging her cargo of lumber at the Fort street wharf.

Four thousand three hundred bags of Hawaii sugar was discharged from the steamer Mauna Loa into the bark Andrew Welch yesterday.

Kona sugar report from Purser Simerson of the steamer Mauna Loa: H. A. Co., 4000 sacks sugar left in warehouse; H. S. Co. & P. S. M., none; K. S. Co., 800 sacks.

RESCUE STEAMER GOES FRIDAY

The Hanalei Will Make Trip to Japs on Laysan Island.

Arrangements have been practically concluded between Messrs. H. Hackfeld & Co., Ltd., and the Inter-Island Steamship Company to send the steamer Hanalei to Laysan Island with provisions for the relief of the Japs and also to look for the bark Ceylon. The only thing that will cancel these arrangements would be the appearance of the Ceylon, and if she is not seen or heard from the Hanalei will probably leave on Friday morning.

The belief is constantly growing in shipping circles that the bark Ceylon has met with disaster. She is now 63 days out on the round trip—twice as long a time as many other vessels have been on the same trip. Some people think that she has gone ashore on Laysan Island during bad weather.

Men were at work yesterday preparing the Hanalei for the trip. She had been lying in the row idle for many weeks until she was placed on the marine railway last week for cleaning and repairs.


Kilauea Still Smoking.


