## GRAND OLD MAN DEAD

John Kanui Passed Away Early in Morning.

### FATHER OF HOME RULE PARTY

Was Grandson of One of the First Hawaiians to be Educated Abroad.

The "Grand Old Man" of Home Rule is dead. Old John Kanui, who first sounded the party slogan of the Hawaiians to combine in the political body which has become known as the Independent Home Rule party, and who was its first honorary president, died at 2 o'clock yesterday morning at the Queen's Hospital. He was buried yesterday afternoon at 4 o'clock in the little cemetery of Puu o Kamalii, back of Palama, the remains being followed to the grave by a large concourse of Hawaiians.

The aged Hawaiian publicist, who has been a striking figure in the affairs of his people, succumbed to an illness lasting only two days. On Wednesday he caught a slight cold which developed into a fever and he was conveyed to the hospital, where his feeble frame was able to withstand the inroads of the disease for only a few hours. His death was a surprise and a regret to the Hawaiian community, for he was looked upon with reverence by old and young.

The remains were taken to the undertaking establishment of Mrs. Williams and prepared for burial. They were viewed during the day by a throng of Hawaiians, and at four the funeral was held, the pall-bearers being T. C. Polikapu, J. Keau, J. P. Kahanawai, J. M. Poepe, S. H. Meekapu, D. Al, J. Holoua, J. H. Kanakalilli, nearly all from the Home Rule committees. Delegate and Mrs. Wilcox were present at the services.

John Kanui was born at Honuaula, Maui, in 1830, and was educated at Lahainaluna Seminary. For the past fifty years he has been a lawyer in the district courts. When the time came for the islanders to take part in national politics, Kanui, who had been a leader in the Kala Aina and Aloha Aina societies, became the recognized head of the new political movement which finally took form as the Independent, or Home Rule party. He was familiarly known amongst his own people as the "Grand Old Man" of the Home Rule party, and they delighted in likening him to Gladstone. He was made honorary president and given the chairmanship of the finance committee. He was also a member of the executive committee.

Kanui's grandfather was one of the four Hawaiians who were taken to the United States to be educated long before the first missionaries landed in the islands in 1820. John Kanui, the elder, was educated at Cornell University and returned to the islands in 1820 in company with Rev. Hiram Bingham, the elder, Rev. Thurston, and others. His native companions were Honouli, Hopu and George Humehume, the latter the son of the chief of Kauai. The elder Kanui was buried in the missionary section of the Kawalahao church cemetery.



So energetic is this action that a small particle lights up a mass of zinc sulphide a thousand times as large, and this phosphorescence continues a considerable time after removal of the radium.


