

### M'CULLY TRACT CARS NEXT WEEK

The Extension May be Ready for Transporting Passengers on Monday.

The McCully tract extension of the Rapid Transit system will probably be completed at the end of the present week. The work of filling in the finishing ballast for the road is under way now and Manager Ballentyne believes that it will be done by Saturday. The ballast earth and stone is being hauled over the extension by electric cars which run to the end of the line on Walkiki road, which is about opposite Kealia road.

If the road is completed on Saturday cars will in all probability commence running over it regularly on Monday. The plan is to put on an extra car on the King street line and another on the Wilder avenue line. The Wilder avenue cars are to run down Alexander street to King street, the passengers to be transferred to the King street cars, which will run over the McCully tract extension. In other words the Wilder avenue line is from Wylie street down Liliha to King, Hotel, Lunallo, Pensacola, Wilder avenue, Alexander to King. The King street line will have a complete through service from Kahlili to the end of the McCully tract extension, ending at the Walkiki road.




