**WHO KILLED
JAP WOMAN?**

**Body Found in Her
Room Yesterday
Afternoon.**

A coroner's jury at 4 o'clock on Thursday afternoon will try to unravel the mystery surrounding the death of a Japanese woman who was found dead shortly after noon yesterday in her room in a building on Pauahi street.

The woman's body is now at the morgue, and the story as far as known concerning her death, points to poisoning.

On Monday evening a Chinaman spent the evening with her and the two had dinner together in the room. Then the Chinaman dropped out. Yesterday the police found the woman lying dead on her bed. She had her day attire on, and her tongue was swollen. On a table near by was a plate of chicken and a small dish of Jap sauce.

An autopsy over her body will be held and the food found examined to learn if there are any traces of poisoning.

**HONOLULU FIX
UP THE TEAM**

Several Changes Have No Effect on the Men's Confidence.

The second football game of the season promises to exceed in interest the first, from the fact that its outcome is even more in doubt. The game will be between the Honolulu Athletic Club and the Punahou, the latter being in their second game, while the former have had only the practices against their second eleven as a means of trying their strength.

The Punahou promise to have no changes in their team from that which met and defeated the Malle Ilmas on Saturday last. Morse was not badly hurt, though he was unconscious for something like ten minutes after he was thrown. There had been threats that he would be put out of the game and several Punahou players have been making inquiries as to how the half back met with such hard treatment. They have been satisfied that the fall was due only to the tackle and the nature of the drop, and that there was no feature which might be criticised as dirty work during the game. The talk was entirely on the part of some of the Malle players, it is alleged, and was frowned upon by the team at large, and no attempt made to take unfair advantage.

The Honolulu team will outweigh the Punahou, and there will be more than mere weight in the opposition. The red legs have worked hard to get into their condition and they have a fast and hard team. The men have been carefully schooled by Coach Brooks, and they strike the opposing line with great force and the interference is excellent. Fullback Blaisdell is off color for the time, but it is said will be in his place on Saturday. Cunha has not shown up and Mark Hochstetler will be put in center. His guards will be the Cocketts, while Joy and Chillingworth will play the tackle places. This leaves Scott and Antone Lawrence for the ends, and they are showing up well. Fernandez is trying for a back place, and in the event of a fullback being needed Joy will be able to take the stunt and as he punts high and hard, it is safe to say that he would play the place well. There are substitutes for each place on the team. Charles F. Chillingworth has been elected captain and Quarterback Russel vice-captain of the team.

Punahou is saying nothing but working all the time. This evening will see the last game of the practice season for the Honolulu, as they have let up and will after this afternoon devote themselves to signals. The game will commence Saturday at 3:30 o'clock.
