

MRS. FRANCIS MURPHY IS SUED

LOS ANGELES, Nov. 29.—News reached Los Angeles that the Sacramento Coffee Club has failed and that Mrs. Sarah J. Knox has brought suit against the stockholders to collect \$199 due for rent. Mrs. Francis Murphy, wife of the famous temperance lecturer, now in Los Angeles, is named in the complaint as one of the defendants. Mrs. Murphy declares she has no financial interest in the enterprise and has never been a stockholder.

"When I was in Sacramento," she said, "leading men and women of the place were discussing the advisability of starting a coffee house and, believing that it would be a good thing, I gave it what encouragement I could, but put no money in it, and had nothing to do with its management."

Nominations for a successor to Bishop Gulstan have already been sent to Rome, an election having been held among the Catholic clergy over a month ago.

Supt. Cooper is to make an investigation of the floor structure of the Judiciary building, which it is said is very weak in places. It got a bad additional wrench yesterday.

Judge Estee will render a written decision in the case of B. H. Wright this morning. Wright it is said has finally induced friends to go on his bond, and even if his bail is not reduced will be at liberty within a few days.

Rosa Dias, a young Portuguese girl, who has been before Judge Wilcox on several occasions, was brought before him again yesterday morning on a warrant sworn to by her father, charging her with disobedience. Judge Wilcox gave her a lecture and told her to go home and obey her parents.

The Queen's Claim.

The New York Tribune's Washington correspondence contains the following: "H. M. Queen Liliuokalani, Hawaii," as she was registered at the Ebbitt House last night, was in conference today with her attorney regarding measures to be adopted for collecting from this government \$3,000,000 or more which she claims for the loss of the Hawaiian crown lands. Mrs. Dominis, as the ex-Queen is known in this country, is accompanied by Myra Heleluhe, a companion, and by her secretary, John D. Aimoku. It is said that the election of Prince Cupid as the Territorial Representative in Congress is indicative of the power which the ex-Queen still wields over her former subjects. He is expected to arrive in the city this week, and it is understood that he will take up the claim of his former Queen and press it for settlement.

Bishop Gulstan Not to Travel.
Conflicting messages regarding the health of Bishop Gulstan were received from Hilo yesterday by Father Valentin. In the forenoon a message was received from Father Oliver, as follows: "Bishop more pleasant; may live; will go to Honolulu tomorrow with Fathers Matthias and Libert."

In the afternoon another message was received to the effect that the plans had been changed and that the Bishop would not be brought back here. At the Mission it is believed that this change was made either because the passage over from Hilo would be very rough this week, or that the Bishop is in such a weak physical state that it would cause him to suffer a further relapse.




