HERMANN STRAUCH SUICIDES

Hermann Strauch, a young German employed at Hackfeld & Company, committed suicide between 6:30 and 9:30 o'clock last night in his room in the bachelor quarters of several young Germans on Christley lane, Fort street, by shooting himself in the head.

The affair was a shocking incident in the usually happy household composed of Messrs. von Damm, Mueller, Hildebrand and Strauch. The latter is about eighteen years of age and came direct to Hawaii from Bremen, Germany, about a year and a half ago, and was employed in Hackfeld's up to the time of his death.

Mr. von Damm found the body lying fully dressed on his couch, the bullet having penetrated the right temple. The revolver was found lying at his side. Strauch was in good spirits about 6:30 when all the young men left the house.

INQUEST ON THE KERR & CO. FIRE

List of the Insurance Companies Affected by Destruction of Property.

Appraisalment of the ruined stock in the L. B. Kerr & Co. building which was destroyed by fire on Saturday night has not yet commenced and it is not known yet whether there will be salvage amounting to enough to pay for the trouble of preparing the stuff for sale.

A. R. Gurrey of the Insurance Underwriters has prepared a list of all the insurance held by Kerr & Co., the companies and the amount being as follows: Underwriters, \$5,000; Hartford, \$5,000; Hartford, \$2,500; Firemen's Fund, \$2,500; Royal Insurance Co., \$5,000; Hamburg Bremen, \$5,000; New Zealand, \$10,000; Manchester Assurance, \$5,000; Magdeburg, \$5,000; Insurance Company of North America, \$10,000; Scottish Union and National, \$5,000; Aetna, \$10,000; Sun Insurance Office, \$2,500; Caledonian, \$10,000; London & Lancashire, \$2,500; London & Lancashire, \$5,000; Alliance Assurance Co., \$5,000. A total of \$95,000.

The stock value is said to be about \$135,000, the figures already given in the Advertiser. An inquest will be held to satisfy the insurance men as to the origin of the fire.
