PAYMASTER RHODES DIES OF APPENDICITIS

Paymaster Stuart Rhodes of the U. S. Naval Station died yesterday afternoon at four o'clock. He was operated upon for appendicitis on Wednesday but death was not immediately due to the operation, the patient being in a very low state of vitality. The remains will be shipped to California on the Naval Supply Ship Iris, which leaves for San Francisco tomorrow.

Paymaster Rhodes was 23 years of age and had attained the rank of lieutenant in the pay department. He secured his appointment some three years ago through the influence of Mark Hanna, a close friend of his father, now dead for some years. He passed through Honolulu three years ago on his way to duty with the Asiatic Squadron as assistant paymaster and was appointed in charge of the Honolulu station in April of this year relieving Paymaster Hall. He came from Batavia, New York.

The late paymaster was expecting his mother, Mrs. C. L. Rhodes, to join him at Honolulu. Mrs. Rhodes is now at San Francisco and a cablegram was sent to her by Admiral Terry Thursday to prevent her starting. Owing to an uncertainty of address the message failed to connect and was returned. Another message was sent to the Colonel yesterday which it is hoped will reach her in time. She was supposed to have come by the transport Sheridan, which leaves San Francisco today, though another rumor has it that she intended leaving by the Sierra on Thursday in which case the message was of no avail. The deceased was her only child.

The deceased was attended by Dr. Taylor, the naval surgeon, who with assistance performed the operation. The patient's pulse was barely perceptible after the operation until death though Paymaster Rhodes himself retained consciousness and expressed a belief yesterday morning that he would pull through.

Admiral Terry stated last night that there would be no official funeral beyond the accompaniment of the casket to the Iris by the officers now here. The Irregulars being away and Captain Niblack ill there is no available way of holding any public ceremony. A successor will shortly be appointed.

FEBRUARY TOURISTS

The trend of duly organized tours has set towards Hawaii. Charles H. Gates of Toledo, Ohio, who for eleven years has been conducting parties of travelers on pleasure bent to various tourist haunts, has, with the issue of an attractive brochure entitled "Hawaii and the Volcano of Kilauea," announced two tours to this Territory of three weeks and four weeks duration starting respectively from San Francisco and Chicago on February 20 and February 11, both parties arriving here on February 27th.

A round trip rate including absolutely all expenses of the trip except steward fees fixes the price at \$245 from San Francisco and \$410 from Chicago. Tickets are good for four months if a longer stay is desired.

The itinerary in each case includes a trip to the Kilauea Volcano and Hilo. There will be shorter trips to Waikiki beach, Kapalani Park, Punchbowl hill, Nuuanu Pail, Manoa valley and a trip over the Oahu railroad, through Ewa plantation to Waialae. There will also be carriage drives to Bishop Museum and other places of interest in Honolulu.

Hawaii is described in the brochure, which is illustrated as a "Pacific Paradise," as the "Land of Perpetual Bloom," where perpetual summer reigns, the atmosphere is soothing, refreshing and sweet, especially during the winter months offering an incomparable retreat for the delicately constituted.
