

**TAFT'S RECEPTION  
DETAILS PENDING**

Governor Carter has a number of matters to bring before Secretary-elect Taft of the Department of War, if opportunity offers. It will depend on a good deal on Mr. Taft himself what the plans for the day will be.

If possible, the Governor would like to have Mr. Taft receive the public, especially the business element, at the Alexander Young Hotel this afternoon or evening. If anything be arranged in time, it will be announced in the afternoon papers.

Late last night Secretary Atkinson communicated with Manager Lake and suggested that a reception be given on the roof garden in the evening, so that the Secretary might meet Honolulu socially. There is to be a band concert at the hotel complimentary to Secretary Taft and the passengers of the Korea, including the Persian Grand Vizier if he is present. After this, with music by the augmented Hawaiian Quintette Club, there will be dancing and an opportunity to meet our distinguished guest.

Mr. Taft will be met on the arrival of the steamship Korea by Governor Carter, accompanied by Secretary Atkinson and attended by Col. J. W. Jones, commanding; Col. J. H. Soper, adjutant general; Major J. W. Pratt, paymaster general; Lt. Col. C. W. Zeigler, Major Riley and Capt. Johnson, officers of the Hawaiian National Guard.
