Driving Accident.

Shortly after one o'clock yesterday afternoon a lively stable carriage drawn by a frisky span came to grief against a telephone pole at the entrance of the driveway leading to the front of the Hawaiian hotel. There were two men and a woman in the carriage, one of the former driving. The carriage was about to be driven up to the hotel, when the off horse plunged at sight of an approaching electric car at Richards street. The high horse broke the other way, there was a parting of straps, and with a crash the carriage pole was splintered against the telephone pole. Quicker than it is told the occupants found their feet on the ground. Men from the Hawaiian Hotel Stables came to the rescue and secured the frightened animals. Farther down Hotel street the off horse had shied at an automobile.

Came to Life.

Considerable excitement was caused Friday night by the report that B. S. Boyd, former Land Commissioner, had committed suicide. He has recently been in the Police Court for assaulting his wife and is now awaiting trial on the charge of appropriating government funds. He told his wife Friday that he was going to end his troubles and was shortly afterward found apparently dead. A doctor was summoned and the corpse brought to life by means of ammonia applied to the nostrils. It is said that he explained that he was playing a joke on his wife but yesterday he strenuously denied this story, saying that his unconsciousness was due to mental stress caused by his troubles.

Was Despondent.

K. Kale, a Japanese about thirty-four years of age, attempted suicide yesterday morning. He has been bothered with a sore foot caused by his stepping on a nail some time ago. He got despondent and yesterday attempted suicide by cutting his throat with a razor. He was taken to the Japanese hospital where his condition is said to be critical.
