

## SEND PRESENTS ON THE MONGOLIA

Santa Claus will arrive with the bulk of his Christmas presents from the mainland on the Pacific Mail steamship Siberia on Saturday, December 24. The good old saint will, however, probably have many of his presents on the steamship China, which arrives the same day from the Orient.

The last boat to carry Christmas presents as far as New York and Boston, to arrive there in time for Christmas, will be the Pacific Mail steamship Mongolia, sailing on Saturday next. The vessel will arrive in San Francisco on or about December 16. The next opportunity to get Christmas presents away will be on the Aorangi, which is scheduled to leave Honolulu for Victoria on December 14.

The Alameda sails from Honolulu for San Francisco on December 21, which will land mails in San Francisco the day after Christmas.
