### VENTURA ARRIVES WITH BIG CARGO

The Ventura arrived last evening about eight o'clock. She brought a rather small passenger list for this port but has a fair-sized crowd for the Colonies. The Ventura made the run from San Francisco in five days and nineteen hours, leaving there at nearly midnight of the 23rd. She has 607 tons of freight for this port and 1750 tons of coal. A large gang of native stevedores will have to work all night to get it aboard. The agents hope to get the boat away by noon but as she has to be put on a lighter, there is some doubt about the matter.

### Shipping Notes.

The Kinahu, although sailing a day late, will arrive from Hilo and way ports on Saturday morning.

Next Monday being a holiday, freight will be received at the Inter-Island wharf on Saturday for the Kauai boats.

The wardroom officers of the Naval Station paid an official visit yesterday morning on the French cruiser Protet.

The W. G. Hall is expected to arrive this morning from Kauai with a full load of sugar. She will sail this afternoon at five for Ahukini for another load.

The Gerard C. Tobey arrived yesterday, seventeen days out from San Francisco, which is the record time for some months past. She has been in sight of land for several days.

The bark Emily F. Whitney is loading sugar at Makaweli. She had 18,000 bags aboard day before yesterday. She will sail for San Francisco as soon as she gets a full load.

The schooner Lavinia, Captain Weisbarth, has been out 99 days on a voyage to Palmyra Island, thence to San Francisco with coconuts, without having been heard from.

The schooner Alice Cooke arrived yesterday, 37 days from Port Gamble, with a cargo of lumber for Lewers & Cooke. She had a rough trip and has been in sight of the islands since last Friday.

The steamer Kauai will take the W. G. Hall's Kauai run next Tuesday. The Hall takes the Mauna Loa's Hawaii run, while the latter will be laid up for one trip to be thoroughly overhauled.

Capt. Niblack took the Iroquois out for a trial spin yesterday morning to see how she went after her recent thorough overhauling. Her compasses were found to be slightly out of kilter and were readjusted.

The revenue cutter Bear arrived yesterday, 12 days out from San Francisco, and is anchored in Naval row. She will remain here for about six months. Her officers are: Captain O. C.
