LOCAL BREVITIES.

Mrs. J. A. Magoon and daughter, Kathleen, leave for San Francisco on the Mongolia for an indefinite stay.

The funeral of the late Franz Buchholz whose body was brought from Hoopua in the steamer Mauna Loa, took place from the German Lutheran church yesterday afternoon.

Mr. W. H. Pfeiffer leaves Monday on the Mongolia en route to London, where he will visit his mother and sisters. He will then go to Berlin to enter upon a course in electrical engineering.

M. A. Harris, president and manager of the Golden Gate Dredging Co., is in Honolulu. It is supposed with an eye to business when the Federal appropriation for Honolulu harbor improvement comes to be expended.

Prof. George Mead, professor of Psychology at Chicago University, Chicago, gave an interesting lecture yesterday afternoon before the Mothers' and Teachers' meeting at the Y. W. C. A. hall, on the "Relation of the School to the Family." A large audience of ladies and gentlemen, mostly teachers, was present.

It is reported that the grand jury has obtained valuable evidence regarding the burning of Kaawa school-house on this island. There is a theory that the building was destroyed out of malice toward Mr. Marshall, the contractor who had erected the building but had not received payment when the fire occurred.

Several witnesses were examined in the Delegate's election contest before Judge Dole yesterday. Their evidence referred to the "red shirt brigade," to numbered ballots cast and to threats of loss of employment alleged to have been made to workers on the public roads by Supervisor Sam Johnson and Jim Kupieha, if the men threatened attended Democratic or Home Rule meetings or failed to vote the Republican ticket.

Allen had resigned the presidency on account of his health.

Kamaaina Dies.

Louis Adler, a kamaaina, aged 86 years, died at his residence on Vineyard street at 9 o'clock last night. He formerly conducted a shoe store on Nuuanu street, where the Honolulu Iron Works building now stands. He was a prominent member of the G. A. R. Two daughters and a son survive him. Funeral arrangements will be announced later.
