

## FERNANDEZ KIN TO LILIUOKALANI

The Salt Lake Tribune of April 27, has the following:

Among the men subpoenaed to appear before the grand jury at Honolulu to testify on the question of whether or not polygamy exists on the island is Abraham Fernandez, whose family spent one winter in this city. The family consisted of wife, two daughters and a son, the daughters having been educated in Europe and having had all the advantages that wealth could obtain. The son was a student at the Brigham Young academy, Provo, and before returning to Honolulu married one of Utah's native daughters, Miss Lydia Roberts of Provo.

Mr. Fernandez, the father, is a wealthy hardware merchant of Honolulu and owns a large sugar plantation a few miles outside the city of Honolulu. The family is related to ex-Queen Liliuokalani, and the wife and daughters of Mr. Fernandez assisted in receiving the guests at the reception given in honor of the Queen at the Bee Hive house in this city several years ago.

The Fernandez home, on the big plantation just outside Honolulu, is the headquarters for Mormon missionaries traveling on the island. They are always royally entertained by Mr. Fernandez and his family, all of whom are members of the Mormon church. It is forty years or more since the family visited Salt Lake, but they will be pleasantly remembered by many acquaintances made during their stay here.

There will be no encampment of the Hawaiian National Guard this year owing to lack of both Federal and Territorial appropriations.

The Spanish War Veterans have been invited to join the local Grand Army Post in the observance of Memorial day, and have accepted the invitation.

The Japanese theater was filled to overflowing last night to hear speeches on immigration companies and the Kei Hin bank. Editor Shiozawa presided.

There will be an industrial exhibition and sale of fancy work, lauhala weaving, etc., in the grounds of the Kawaiahao Seminary on Monday afternoon, May 22nd. The Hawaiian band will play during the afternoon.

The Korean government has appointed Hon. Miki Saito, Japanese consul general to Hawaii, honorary consul for Korea in this Territory. A Seoul dispatch to the Tokio Jiji says that this was done for the protection of Korean life and property here.

Two mulatto women, who are said by the police to have been leading immoral lives, were arrested in Iwilei last evening and taken to the station house. One is said to have had a habit of abstracting rings from the fingers of sailors and a charge to this effect may be brought against her.

An important special meeting of Wilder's Steamship Co. is called for Monday the 29th inst. It is for the purpose of considering a proposal for selling all the business and property of the company and dissolving the incorporation. This of course refers to the projected amalgamation of Wilder's with the I. I. S. N. Co.

Captain Johnson will have charge of a team which will represent Hawaii at the National Guard sharpshooting contest at Seagirt, N. J. Captain Johnson has an important Government position at Honolulu.—Chronicle.


