LAW AGAINST MOSQUITOES. Fifty Dollars Fine for Harboring the Pest.

The Board of Supervisors of San Mateo, California, has outlawed the mosquito and declared him a nuisance subject to abatement under appropriate pains and penalties.

Section 1. All pools of water or other places in which mosquitoes are bred and are hereby declared to be public nuisances.

Section 2. Upon being notified by such health officers or boards of health of the existence of such pools of water or other places in which mosquitoes are bred and that the same has been declared a public nuisance by said health officers or boards of health, it shall be the duty of the person or persons responsible for the maintenance thereof to forthwith abate such nuisance, and all persons refusing or neglecting to forthwith abate such nuisance as directed by said health officers or boards of health shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor and upon conviction thereof shall be fined not more than fifty (50) dollars or be imprisoned in the county jail not more than twenty-five (25) days, or by both such fine and imprisonment.

Section 3. The ordinance shall take effect fifteen days from and after its passage.

The ordinance had its inception in the San Mateo Board of Trade and was presented by a joint committee of that body and the San Mateo Park Improvement Club.

There has been expended in the territory from San Mateo to San Bruno this season about \$2000 in fighting mosquitoes. The work has been carried on under the direction of Professor Quayle, entomologist of the State University, and C. M. Morse of this city, a member of the National Mosquito Extermination Society.

So effective has this work been that for the first time in its history this community is practically free from the mosquito pest.

NEW YORK, July 30.—High up on the roof of the Ansonia, the tallest apartment house in the world, is one of the most productive chicken farms in the country, considering its size.

Having shipped the first consignment of chickens to the country farm, Master Stokes followed in their wake, and is now busy at the seaside with his roof-garden pets as he was here during their process of incubation.

Some specimens of the kind of manual training that pays have been sent to Superintendent Davis from the public school at Kealahou, Maui.

The school is in charge of J. De Vincent, who likewise instructs the scholars in the manual work for which the school will get a reputation.

The articles consist of candelabra and picture frames made of narrow strips of sheet iron, turned and twisted in the most ornate shapes conceivable.
