One of the evening papers seems to have misunderstood my report on the Garbage Department," said Chief Clerk Clarence White of the Public Works Department yesterday. "I do not say anywhere that the men did not receive Sundays that they were entitled to.

"The men received pay for 642 days. Of these, sixty-six were Sundays and holidays. Mr. Trent's figures make only sixty-two Sundays and holidays. I do not admit that I made a mistake in my figures, but even at that the difference in only four days—which is not much, considering the intricate system of figuring. I am most emphatically in favor of a flat daily wage rate."

Acting-Governor Atkinson found Mr. White's report on his desk when he reached his office yesterday morning, and has it now under consideration. In the meantime, news of the garbage muss has reached Sam Johnson, in San Francisco, asking whether Sam should return to Honolulu. Mr. Lucas replied to this that there was no occasion to come back, and told Captain Johnson to go on to Seagirt and shoot. In other quarters, there were no further developments yesterday in the affair, although Clarence White handed a copy of his report to County Attorney Douthitt.
